The meeting of the North Carolina Board of Barber and Electrolysis Examiners was called to order at 7:11 p.m., on April 2, 2023.

#### **OPEN SESSION**

#### Ethics awareness and conflict of interest

Mr. Holloway read the statement required by G.S. § 138A-15(e) on ethics awareness and conflicts of interest. No board members indicated that they had any potential or actual conflicts.

#### Adoption of temporary rules

Mr. Holloway referred board members to Mr. Seavers's March 30, 2023 memo on temporary rules to adopt, mostly dealing with mobile barber shops (see Attachment 1). Mr. Holloway noted there were public comments that had been submitted and that the board members had reviewed before the meeting. Dr. Burkhart made a motion to adopt the 68 temporary rules in Attachment 1. Ms. Proctor seconded the motion, which passed, 5–0.

#### **Beaufort County Community College**

Mr. Holloway asked Mr. Seavers to give a brief background on the circumstances leading to the request by Beaufort County Community College for a consent order. SUBJECT: Rulemaking—mobile barber shops

House Bill 792 was signed by the governor on July 8, 2022, and most provisions went into effect on January 1, 2023. Among other provisions, the bill created a new type of license for mobile barber shops, which previously were prohibited. The board proposed temporary rules in January and has been collecting public comments. At its April 2, 2023, the board will consider the public comments and adopt rules.

I have not included a summary of all the rules in this memo because the board has been reviewing these rules for several months and is familiar with the rule provisions. However, board members can find an explanatory memo attached to the minutes of the January 10, 2023 meeting (see https://www.barbers.nc.gov/meetings.html). Board members may also wish to review the public comments submitted on previous drafts of the rules (see in particular the minutes from the December 2022 meeting of the former Board of Barber Examiners).

The board received public comments from three individuals, and the comments are attached to this memo. There was no participation in the public hearing. Before the board adopts the temporary rules, it must fully consider the public comments. The board is not required to discuss the comments at the meeting, but members must have given consideration to them before adopting rules.

Please note that I have made some minor changes to rules to correct errors and ensure consistency; none of them are substantive changes. Since the code was updated with the board's statutes following publication of the rules, I also updated citations so they refer to the statutes rather than session law.

#### **BOARD ACTION AND FUTURE STEPS**

1. Once the board decides on the final language of the rules (whether the attached language or something similar), it should make a motion to **adopt** the rules.

- 2. I will file these rules with the Rules Review Commission, which will consider them at its next meeting.
- 3. Assuming the commission approves the rules, they will go into effect May 2, 2023.
- 4. The board staff will work to build out the licensing process once the language of the rules is finalized. (Much of the work has been ongoing for months.)

The temporary rules will be effective for no more than 270 days following publication in the North Carolina Register. Before the temporary rules expire, the board must approve permanent rules. That permanent rulemaking process will begin after the Office of State Budget and Management approves a fiscal note and substantive economic analysis that I will prepare over the next several weeks.

- 4 (a) An individual who wishes to make a complaint alleging a violation of G.S. 86A [S.L. 2022 72, s. 2,] G.S. 86B or
- 5 the Board's rules shall submit the complaint in writing to the address or through the website set forth in 21 NCAC 06A
- 6 .0102.
- 7 (b) Upon receipt of a complaint, the Board's Executive Director shall review the complaint. The Executive Director
- 8 shall <u>investigate or</u> assign a staff member to investigate the complaint, except for complaints that are dismissed as set
- 9 forth in Paragraph (c) of this Rule.
- 10 (c) The Executive Director shall dismiss the complaint and notify the complainant if the complaint:
  - (1) lacks information, such as <u>barbershop business</u> location or a description of the alleged conduct, necessary to investigate the complaint. Before dismissal, the Executive Director shall attempt to collect additional information from the complainant; or
  - (2) alleges conduct that is not prohibited by G.S. 86A [S.L. 2022 72, s. 2,] G.S. 86B or the Board's rules or is not within the Board's jurisdiction. The Executive Director shall refer the complaint to any other agency that may have jurisdiction.
  - (d) After conducting an investigation, the assigned staff member shall:
    - (1) recommend to the Executive Director that the Board counsel issue a probable cause letter for violations of G.S. 86A [S.L. 2022 72, s. 2,] G.S. 86B or the Board's rules; or
    - (2) recommend that the Executive Director dismiss the complaint because there is insufficient evidence of a violation of G.S. 86A [S.L. 2022 72, s. 2,] G.S. 86B or the Board's rules or the alleged conduct is not within the Board's jurisdiction.
  - (e) After receiving a recommendation required by Paragraph (d) of this Rule, the Executive Director shall:
    - (1) <u>conduct or</u> request additional investigation by the assigned staff member on a case-by-case basis when the recommendation does not contain facts to support the actions set forth in Subparagraphs (2) or (3) of this Paragraph;
    - (2) recommend that the Board counsel issue a probable cause letter for violations of G.S. 86A [S.L. 2022 72, s. 2,] G.S. 86B or the Board's rules; or
  - (3) dismiss the complaint and notify the complainant, except that the Executive Director shall refer the complaint to any other agency that may have jurisdiction.
    - (f) At each regularly scheduled Board meeting, the Executive Director shall submit to the Board a report of dismissed complaints that he or she has not previously reported, with a summary of the allegations and a justification for the dismissal. If the complaint was dismissed within 30 days of the Board meeting, the Executive Director may instead include the dismissal in the report for the Board meeting following the next regularly scheduled meeting.
- (g) By a majority vote, the Board may reopen any complaint that the Executive Director has dismissed, in which case
   the complaint shall be handled as if the Executive Director had not dismissed the complaint.

This AGREEMENT AND CONSENT ORDER is made between the North Carolina Board of Barber and Electrolysis Examiners (the "Board") and Beaufort County Community College (the "Petitioner") for the purposes of resolving a potential contested case.

#### **WITNESS THAT:**

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. § 86B-29(a) requires barber schools to be inspected before operating; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner has held a barber school license, effective June 22, 2022, to May 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner contracted with a vendor to provide a facility, equipment, and personnel for its barber program; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner conducted an investigation of various matters dealing with school administration and identified items with which the school had concerns; and

WHEREAS, the contractor suddenly stopped providing services, leaving the barber program without a facility, equipment, or personnel; and

#### WHEREAS, Petitioner:

- has identified another licensed instructor to serve as school manager;
- is identifying a long-term location for the barber school; and

is able to offer the classroom portions of the curriculum consistent with 21 N.C.
 Admin. Code 06F .0120 both online and at existing Beaufort County Community
 College facilities; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner and the State have an interest in making sure that barber students continue to receive instruction without disruption to their vocational education; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to resolve and settle this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-22, which mandates that, whenever possible, disputes between a regulatory agency and another person that involve the person's rights, duties or privileges be settled through informal procedure, and pursuant to N. C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-41(c), which authorizes settlement of a contested case by settlement and consent order, the Parties hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

#### I. Jurisdiction

The Board is an occupational licensing board of the State of North Carolina, organized under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 86B-1, et seq. The Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 86B-1 et seq., N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B-1, et seq., and 21 N.C. Admin. Code 06A .0102, et. seq.

### **II.** Identification of Petitioner

Petitioner's mailing address is Beaufort County Community College, 5337 US Highway 264 East, Washington, North Carolina 27889.

# III. Waiver of Rights

Petitioner understands that Petitioner has the following rights:

- A. to a hearing before the Board;
- B. to a Final Agency Decision by the Board;

- C. to be represented by counsel;
- D. to present evidence in mitigation of any sanction that could be imposed for a violation;
- E. to confront and cross-examine witnesses;
- F. to challenge evidence presented by the Board;
- G. to present legal arguments in a brief or orally; and
- H. to appeal from any final decision adverse to Petitioner's license to operate a barber school.

Petitioner hereby freely and knowingly waives these rights without further process, including her right for judicial review under N.C. Gen. Stat. § 150B, Article 4. Based upon the above, Petitioner agrees to the terms of this Consent Order.

To resolve this matter with a Consent Order, Petitioner agrees that the Board staff and counsel may discuss this Consent Order with the Board (and any subcommittee that may be assigned to this matter) *ex parte*, whether or not the Board accepts this Consent Order as written.

# IV. Stipulation to Facts.

Petitioner and the Board stipulate to the following facts:

- A. Petitioner claims that it has appropriate means to offer classroom or online instruction;
- B. Petitioner has identified Russell Shaw as a licensed barber instructor who will serve as school manager, and the Board has verified that Mr. Shaw has a current, valid license;
- C. The Board received a request on March 24, 2023, that Petitioner be allowed to operate a barber school as specified in the Stipulated Order below.

# V. Stipulated Order

Parties consent to the following terms in settlement of this case:

In lieu of proceeding to issuance of a Final Agency Decision, Petitioner and the Board hereby enter into this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order whereby Petitioner and the Board agree to the following terms:

- A. Petitioner agrees to the **Stipulation to Facts** above;
- B. Petitioner will be able to provide classes as set forth in 21 N.C. Admin. Code 06F.0120, beginning April 3, 2023;
- C. Petitioner shall only provide classes online or at Beaufort County Community
   College facilities approved by the Board's executive director;
- D. To the degree possible, the in-person facilities described in Paragraph C above shall comply with the requirements in 21 N.C. Admin. Code 06F .0101(b)(16) and (19);
- E. Apart from the instruction described in Paragraphs B and C above, Petitioner shall not offer any other classes until the requirements in Paragraph F below are fulfilled;
- F. On or before July 1, 2023, Petitioner shall file a barber school permit application as set forth in 21 N.C. Admin. Code 06N .0110 and meet all requirements in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 86B-38.

#### VI. Costs

The parties agree that each party shall bear its own expenses incurred regarding this matter, including attorneys' fees and any other professional services, and that no claim for such expenses shall be made by either party against the other.

#### VII. Effective Date

The effective date of this Order is the date on which it is signed by Parties.

#### VIII. Public Record

The parties agree that this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order is a public record, as required by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 132-1.3. Other related documents are part of the investigative file and are trial preparation materials and are not public records, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 132-1.9.

# IX. Compliance with Settlement Agreement & Consent Order

- A. This Settlement Agreement and Consent Order and its provisions are effective on the date of signature by the Board's Chairperson or designee.
- B. Any modification of this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order must be preapproved in writing by the Board and signed by the Board's Chairperson or designee before it may be effective.
- C. If, during the term of this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order, the Board staff receives evidence that Petitioner has violated any of the above conditions, the Board staff may schedule a Contested Case Hearing for a determination of the violations.
- D. Should circumstances arise that affect the Petitioner's ability to remain in compliance, the Petitioner shall immediately notify the Board in writing by email

at barbers@nc.gov or dennis.seavers@nc.gov, fully describing the situation along with any attendant request for Board consideration.

E. Communications with Petitioner regarding compliance with this Consent Order may occur between the Board staff and Petitioner and shall not be considered *ex parte* communications.

**SUBJECT: Waiver request from NCDAC** 

The North Carolina Department of Adult Corrections ("NCDAC") submitted the attached waiver request. The purpose of this memo is to explain how waivers work, since the rule that allows them is new, and to clarify the background situation that led to NCDAC's request.

#### **Waivers**

In 2022, the Board of Electrolysis Examiners adopted a waiver rule that some other boards had also adopted and which staff at Nichols, Choi & Lee had developed. The rule allows <u>rule-based</u> requirements to be waived under certain conditions. (I emphasize "rule-based" because this waiver rule doesn't allow agencies to waive requirements in statute.) When the merger occurred and the rule was recodified, it applied to the new Board of Barber and Electrolysis Examiners.

I've attached a copy of the rule. Please note the conditions under which the waiver may be granted and the criteria the board must consider.

# **NCDAC** request

The issue that NCDAC is addressing is a requirement in statute for licensees to disclose whether they've been investigated for employee misclassification. This misclassification occurs when a business treats an individual as a contractor or vendor when the individual should have been classified as an employee. Normally, licensees would complete a form online or by paper (if they get a waiver) when they renew, and that form requires them to disclose whether they've been investigated for employee misclassification.

NCDAC has indicated that it would be impractical to distribute these forms to the inmates who are licensed, given the number of licensees and their distribution across the state. The agency would like to have the licenses renewed without having to send forms to inmates and collect the completed forms. The board staff will be available to discuss options with the board at the February meeting.
